1 Employment discrimination: limitation of actions. AB 9 (Reyes D) Extends the filing period with the Department of Fair Employment and Housing (DFEH) for complaints of unlawful employment practices to three years but prohibits the revival of lapsed claims. **A NO vote supports PHCC's position.** Assembly vote 60-5-14. Senate vote 30-7-3. Signed by Newsom.

2 Los Angeles Community College District: best value procurement: pilot program. AB 356 (Santiago D) Authorizes the Los Angeles Community College District to use a best value procurement process as a pilot project until January 1, 2025, for construction projects over \$1 million dollars. The bill contains provisions that allow a contractor under a project labor agreement to be presumed to meet the requirements of using a skilled and trained workforce. **A NO vote supports PHCC's position.** Assembly vote 65-7-7. Senate vote 32-6-2. Signed by Newsom.

3 Division of Labor Standards Enforcement: complaint. AB 403 (Kalra D) incentivizes litigation and provides for a one-sided provision of attorney's fees.

California is already widely perceived as having a hostile litigation environment. One factor that contributes to this negative perception is the high award and threat of attorney's fees in civil litigation that often dwarfs the financial recovery the plaintiff actually receives. **A NO vote supports PHCC's position.** Assembly vote 42-27-11 Senate vote 28-12-0. Vetoed by Newsom.

4 Paid sick leave. AB 555 (Gonzalez D) Expands the state's paid sick leave program to provide an employee with no less than 40 hours or five days of sick leave by the 200th calendar day of employment. **A NO vote supports PHCC's position.** Two-year bill.

5 Professions and vocations: regulatory fees. AB 613 (Low D) Authorizes regulatory boards under the Department of Consumer Affairs to adjust their licensing fees once every four years by an amount not to exceed the increase in the California Consumer Price Index for the preceding four years. **A NO vote supports PHCC's position.** Assembly vote 50-21-9. Two-year bill.

6 Employment: victims of sexual harassment: protections. AB 628 (Bonta D) Uncapped new leave of

absence for employees and their family members. Significantly expands the definition of sexual harassment under the Labor Code, which is different than the definition in the Government Code, leading to inconsistent implementation of anti-harassment policies, confusion, and litigation. Also provides an unprecedented, uncapped leave of absence for victims of sexual harassment and their family members - which is broadly defined, that will add another layer of burdens on employers and their ability to manage their workforce. **A NO vote supports PHCC's position.** Assembly vote 36-15-29. Two-year bill.

7 Water: recycled water. AB 1180 (Friedman D) Requires the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board), on or before January 1, 2023, to update the uniform statewide criteria for nonpotable recycled water uses. **Was amended to address PHCC concerns.** Signed by Newsom.

8 Water projects: financial assistance and construction financing.

AB 1290 (Gloria D) Requires the City of San Diego to use a PLA to receive state funds. **A NO vote supports PHCC's position.** Assembly vote 62-17-0, Senate vote 28-9-3. Signed by Newsom.

9 Transportation: transactions and use taxes.

AB 1413 (Gloria D) Authorizes specified local transportation authorities, which have existing transactions and use tax authority, to levy a transactions and use tax TUT in a portion of its jurisdiction, with voter approval. Requires the use of Skilled and Trained Workforce unless the agency has a PLA. **A NO vote supports PHCC's position.** Assembly vote 50-25-4 Senate vote 28-10-2. Signed by Newsom.

10 CEQA: projects funded by qualified opportunity zone funds or other public funds.

SB 25 (Caballero D) Grants accelerated CEQA appeals for certain housing projects. Requires SATWF unless covered by a PLA, exempts contractors under a PLA from completing CPRs. **A NO vote supports PHCC's position.** Senate vote 28-6-4 Two-year bill.

11 Medium- and heavy-duty vehicles: comprehensive strategy.

SB 44 (Skinner D) Opposition and job killer tag removed due to May 1, 2019 amendments that require CARB to first consult with the Department of Transportation, the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission, and GO-Biz to develop recommended goals and be consistent with the state's Sustainable Freight Plan. It also requires CARB to identify advantages to fleets for early adoption. These amendments better align meeting California's ambitious climate goals with ensuring the state's continued economic vitality. Signed by Newsom.

12 Paid family leave.

SB 135 (Jackson D) SB 135 will significantly harm small employers with as few as five employees by requiring that they provide 12 weeks of a protected leave each year, in addition to existing leaves of absences already required, as well as potentially require larger employers to provide 10 months of protected leave, with the exposure to costly litigation for any alleged violation. Two-year bill.

13 Department of Transportation: retention proceeds

SB 197 (Beall D) This bill removes the Department of Transportation's (Caltrans) sunset provision relative to withholding retention proceeds on public contracts. **A YES vote supports PHCC's position.** Assembly vote 79-0 Senate vote 38-0. Signed by Newsom.

14 Contractors: licensing and regulation.

SB 610 (Glazer D) Extends the operation of the CSLB to January 1, 2024 requires the board to study and report to the Legislature if the current amount of the contractors' bond requirement is sufficient. **A YES vote supports PHCC's position.** Assembly vote 78-0-1. Senate vote 40-0. Signed by Newsom
